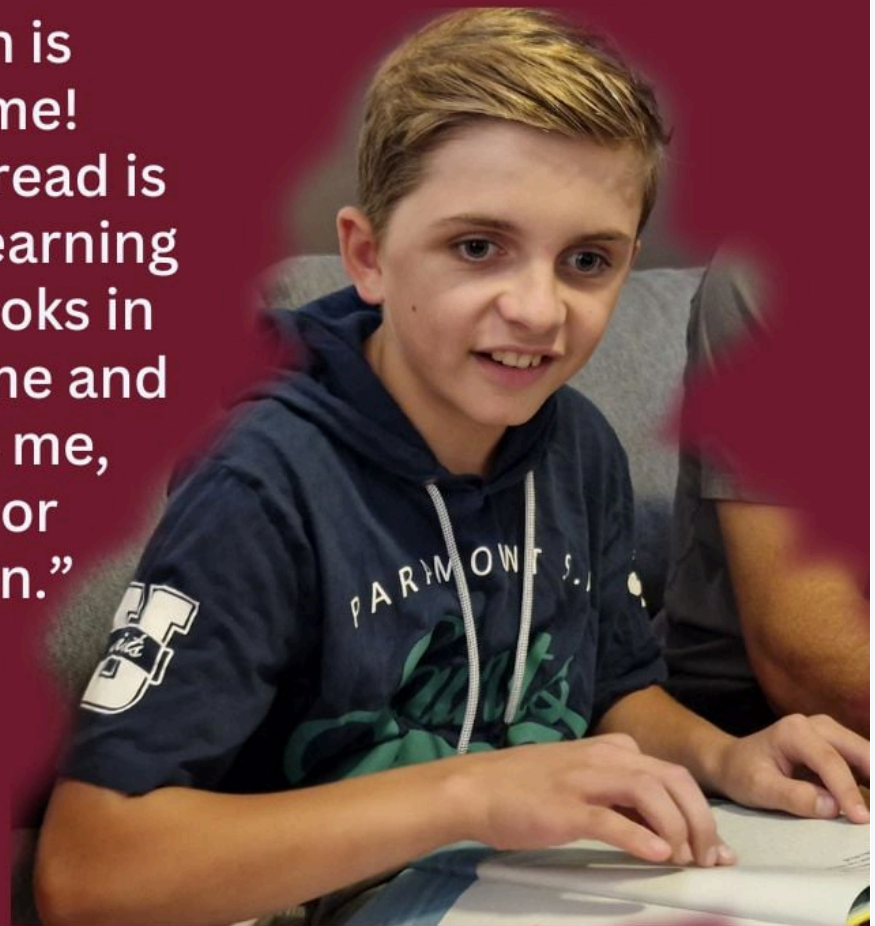

We are members of the Braille House Library and I enjoy reading comedy and sport books. Did you know that for every 100 books available to a sighted child, there are less than five children's books created in Braille?

For me, Braille House is somewhere that I can learn, be challenged, and talk like crazy to new and old friends. They teach how to read Braille, support our community, and bring families together at events like the Braille House Literary Challenge. It is a place where I feel welcome, and I can be myself.

# WE'RE UPGRADING YOUR SEWER NETWORK

## Donaldson Road, Switchboard Upgrade.

Urban Utilities is committed to excellence in water and wastewater services. As part of this commitment, we're upgrading important infrastructure near your property that was impacted during the February 2022 flood events.

The switchboard recovery program involves upgrading the Sewer Pump Station (SPS) switchboards to enhance flood resilience across the Brisbane and Ipswich regions. This includes replacing temporary switchboards, implementing electrical and structural upgrades, constructing elevated platforms at selected sites, and installing rapid-removal switchboards to ensure that our electrical equipment is either elevated above flood levels or can be rapidly removed during heavy rainfall.

### What's happening?

Our delivery partner, Downer WSP and their subcontractors, Allstar Infrastructure and J & P Richardson, will soon commence essential works to upgrade the electrical switchboard located along Donaldson Road, Rocklea and inside the Urban Utilities Oxley Creek Water Reclamation Plant.

Works will commence from **Monday 10 June 2024**, intermittently for up to **four months**. Construction includes the installation of a raised switchboard platform inside Urban Utilities Oxley Creek Water Reclamation Plant and the completion of associated electrical works along Donaldson Road.

## What can I expect

**Noise/dust** - residents may experience varying noise and dust levels from construction machinery and changed vehicle movements.

Residents may also experience possible generator noise when used to provide temporary power supply to switchboards during the commissioning process. We'll let you know in advance before this occurs. Keep a look out in your letterbox for these updates.

**Hours** - we'll be working during the day, between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday. Construction is anticipated to take place intermittently, for up to four months (weather and site conditions permitting). The project will include both civil and electrical works, with the schedule designed to accommodate both phases.

**Changed traffic conditions** will be in place around work areas and access roads. Traffic control will be in place to manage traffic flow, ensure pedestrian safety and maintain local access.

Please take care and observe all signposting, speed limits and any directions given by Traffic Controllers. Safety fencing, barriers and signage will be installed around work areas to keep everyone safe.

**Wastewater services** – this work will not affect your service. There will be no planned interruptions to your sewerage services during this work.

**Restoration** - we will restore all work areas as close to the original condition as possible once the work is complete.

**Our commitment** - the project team will minimise the construction impacts to the extent possible and review work methods as required. We will keep directly impacted neighbours informed by providing regular construction updates during the project.

## Construction update Salisbury station

During June 2024, UNITY Alliance will continue early works as part of the Cross River Rail, Salisbury station accessibility upgrade.

### Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during June 2024, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Earthworks including gravel installation on Dollis Street
- Continue construction of the gantry crane to assist with lifting construction materials over the rail corridor
- Installation of inground services
- Drainage installation works including excavation, steel fixing and concreting
- Service identification using vacuum trucks, and excavation for service installation.

### Out of hours work

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

### What to expect

During these works you may notice some intermittent disruptions such as:

- Intermittent single lane closure on Olivia Avenue, Fairlie Terrace and Dollis Street to access the rail corridor (please see map overleaf). Traffic control and signage will be in place to direct motorists, pedestrians and cyclists around work areas
- Parking on the eastern side of Dollis Street is no longer available until completion of the Salisbury station upgrade
- Light vehicles, trucks and machinery including excavators with jackhammer and rock breaker, bobcat, vacuum trucks, soil sampling drill rig, concrete trucks, concrete pump trucks, small power tools, drills, saws, minor vibrating equipment and mobile lighting towers to light work areas at night.
- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel
- Increased levels of noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery and equipment.

## Construction update Clapham Yard

In June and July 2024, UNITY Alliance will continue earthworks, drainage, bridge works, track construction, overhead electrical works and the installation of services at Clapham Yard.

### Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Sunday in June and July 2024, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Continuing construction works on the Chale Street and Moolabin Creek bridges
- Continuing installation of drainage, service conduits and pits for electrical, communications and cable routes
- Importing materials, including placement and compaction of gravel
- Continue overhead electrical line footing and mast installation works
- Track construction and maintenance work within the rail corridor.

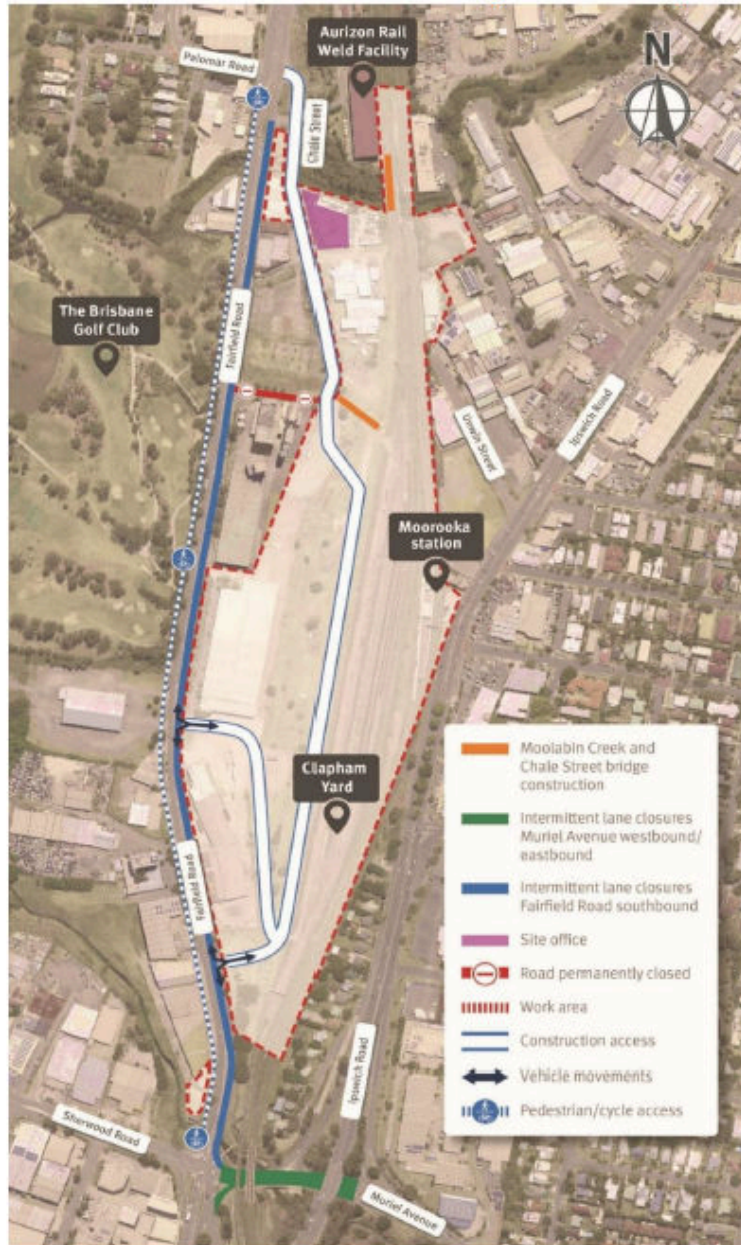

- Changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel

## Rocklea station construction

In May 2024, UNITY Alliance continued overpass and station building fit out, drainage installation and construction of platforms and the commuter carpark.

By the end of June, major construction at Rocklea station will be nearing completion. Notification will be provided to the community ahead of the station reopening.

### Details of work

The following activities are scheduled to occur between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday during June 2024, weather and construction conditions permitting:

- Continue commuter carpark and station entry construction including concreting, landscaping, installing fencing, signs and line marking
- Continue fit out of the new pedestrian overpass and lifts including electrical, lighting and flooring
- Continue fit out of station buildings and platforms including installation of services (e.g., water and electrical)
- Commissioning and testing of the electrical, mechanical, CCTV and public address systems.

The following activities will occur outside the project's normal working hours, as outlined below:

# Moorooka station

## Concept design consultation summary

May 2024

As part of the Cross River Rail project, Moorooka station will be rebuilt to improve accessibility and functionality.

Between Monday 5 February and Sunday 3 March 2024, UNITY Alliance sought feedback on the concept design for the new Moorooka station, as part of the Cross River Rail project.

### Consultation outcomes

Overall, feedback from the community and stakeholders indicated that the station rebuild will improve functionality and accessibility of the station. During the consultation period, more than 230 respondents provided feedback through an online survey, community drop-in sessions and emails to the project team.



### Community feedback

All community and stakeholder feedback received during the consultation period will be considered by the project team and will help inform the final design for construction. The following key points were raised during the community consultation period:

- Positive feedback regarding the functionality and accessibility of the rebuilt station, including lifts, accessible parking and the new kiss 'n' ride drop off area
- Positive feedback regarding the inclusion of additional shelter on station platforms and at the station entry, and improved visual amenity
- Some respondents requested more trees at the station entry and at waiting areas, additional shade on the station platforms and more water fountains at the station.

Feedback was received regarding topics that are outside the project scope for Cross River Rail including adding a pedestrian overpass over Ipswich Road, a pedestrian overpass connecting Moorooka station to Fairfield Road, and improving commuter car parking options by adding a park 'n' ride facility. All feedback regarding out-of-scope topics has been passed onto the relevant agencies for consideration.

While a pedestrian overpass over Ipswich Road is not being built as part of the Cross River Rail project, the Moorooka Station design allows for an overpass to be connected into the station in the future.

### What's next

The Moorooka station design will be further developed and community feedback will be considered. The community will be kept updated as the station design is finalised and will be notified of construction activities well in advance. Early works are underway and timing for the start of construction is dependent on the station design being finalised. The station is planned to be completed in 2026.

# GENERAL MEETING AND PRESENTATION

## **Fiona Giblin, DAF** **‘Saving Australia’s Myrtaceae from myrtle rust?’**

Dr Fiona Giblin is a plant pathologist at the Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries with over 30 years of experience working across a range of crops and different pathogens. She has expertise in fungal epidemiology, pathogenicity, host/pathogen interactions and disease management. She has worked in both research and biosecurity fields and, since 2010, has been involved in the myrtle rust response and subsequent research projects. Her current emphasis is on the conservation of Myrtaceae species severely impacted by the disease.

Myrtle rust has been present in Australia since 2010 and its known host range now includes around 400 species. The presentation will provide a summary of the introduction of the myrtle rust fungus into Australia, followed by an overview of work undertaken over the last 14 years. Current efforts in Queensland and nationally will then be discussed.
